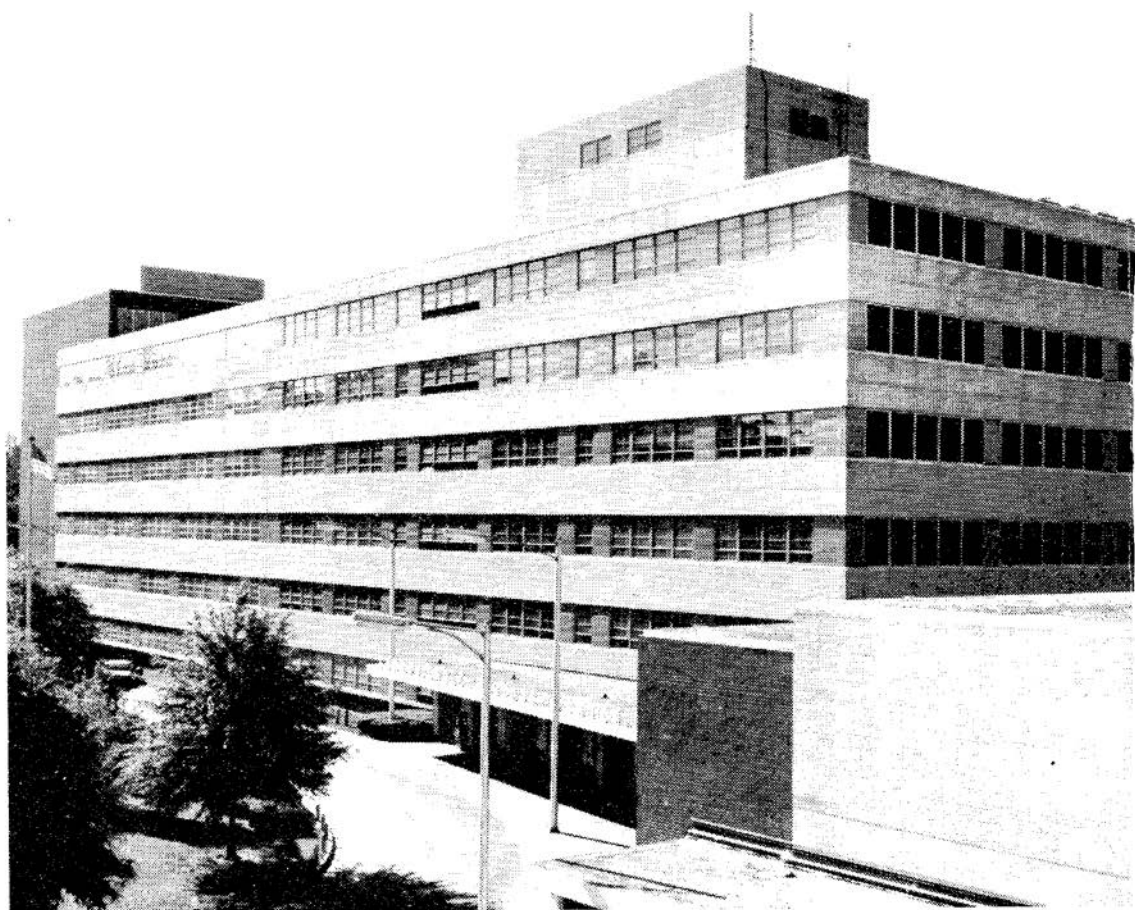

# NCDC

The National Communicable Disease Center (NCDC), with headquarters in Atlanta, Georgia, is the U.S. Public Health Service's national agency for control of infectious and other preventable diseases. NCDC supplements and supports the activities of State health departments by providing specialized services that these agencies are unable to maintain on an everyday basis, and by helping them to develop increasingly effective programs for the prevention, detection, diagnosis, and control of communicable diseases. Through its various services to State and local health departments, NCDC indirectly touches the lives of men, women, and children in all parts of the country and overseas.

Some of these services include help in quelling disease outbreaks, development of practical ways to diagnose and control diseases, the preparation of training materials, consultation and demonstrations of effective ways to appraise and cope with disease problems, and provision of laboratory diagnosis in difficult situations.

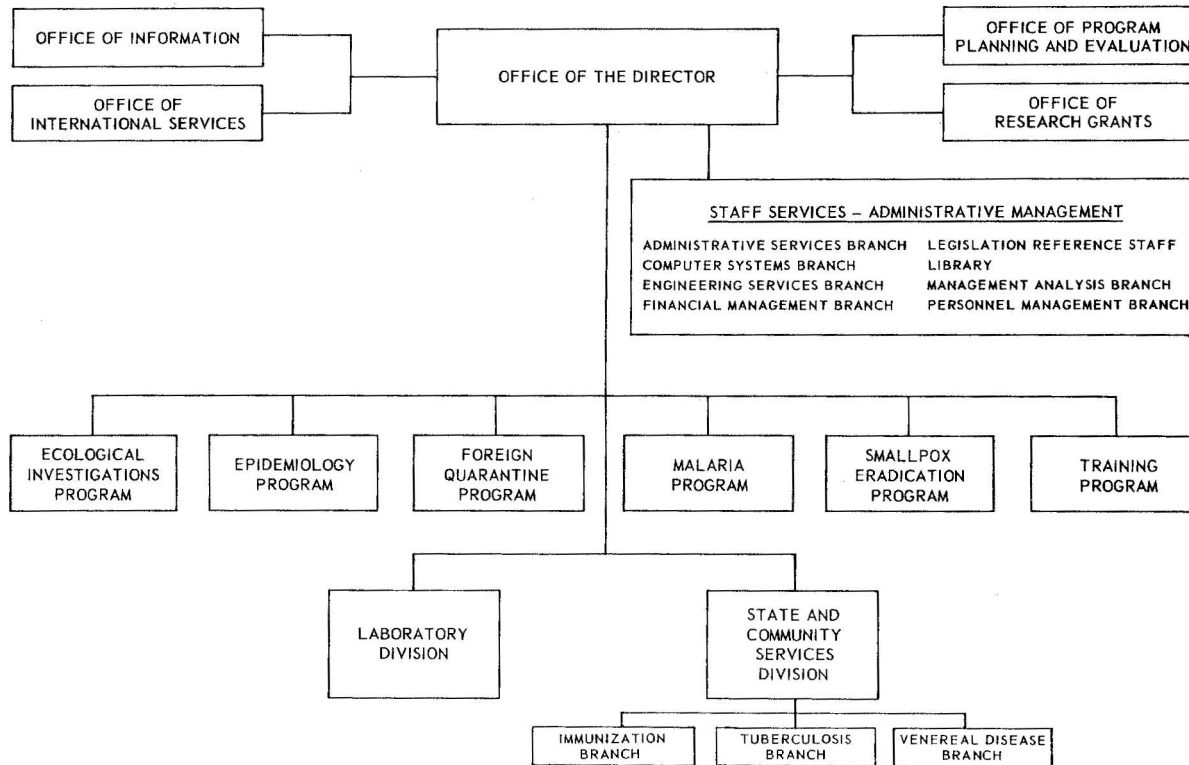
NCDC, jointly with the U.S. Agency for International Development, sponsors two international disease control programs, the Smallpox Eradication Program and the Malaria Program. The principal activity of the Smallpox Eradication Program is the West and Central African Regional Smallpox Eradication and Measles Control Program, operating in 19 African countries; this represents the major U.S. contribution to the WHO global effort to eradicate smallpox from the world by 1977. The West African operation, financed by USAID, provides assistance (in the form of technical advisors, vaccines, jet injectors, and trucks) to all individual countries in the West and Central African region, making possible a coordinated regionwide attack on smallpox and measles. Through an interagency agreement between USPHS and USAID, NCDC is responsible for directing the West African Program. Local costs are borne by the individual countries, with assistance from WHO. Countries participating include: Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Dahomey, Gabon, Gambia, Ghana, Guinea, Ivory Coast, Liberia, Mali, Mauritania, Nigeria, Niger, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Togo, Upper Volta, and Congo (Brazzaville).

Individual country programs are being carried out in close coordination with the two regional African health organizations (OCCGE and OCEAC) and with the World Health Organization's global program.

The Malaria Program assists developing countries with their antimalaria efforts by providing technical skills and commodity support. The programs are financed partly by funds from the participating country and partly by loans and grants from the U.S. Government through AID; UNICEF, WHO, and PAHO may also contribute to their support. The program operates in 18 countries: Brazil, Costa Rica, Ecuador, El Salvador, Ethiopia, Guatemala, Honduras, Haiti, India, Jordan, Nepal, Nicaragua, Pakistan, Panama, Paraguay, Philippines, Thailand, and Vietnam.

# SMALLPOX ERADICATION PROGRAM

Smallpox surveillance and studies of smallpox immunization have been a part of the epidemiological activities of NCDC since its inception. In 1964, the Smallpox Unit of the Surveillance Section of NCDC was formed. This unit was responsible for investigating all suspected cases of smallpox in the United States, conducting studies on the occurrence of smallpox vaccination complications, and evaluating the use of the jet injection apparatus for mass smallpox vaccination.

The Smallpox Eradication Program (SEP) was organized in January 1966 to begin an international project of smallpox eradication and measles control in 16 West African countries. Three additional countries began full-scale participation in the fall of 1967. The West and Central African Regional Smallpox Eradication/Measles Control Program is financed by the U.S. Agency for International Development and directed by NCDC. In addition to the West African operation, the SEP includes a Domestic Branch with responsibility for continuing surveillance of suspected smallpox and the complications of vaccination in the United States. A variety of research activities concerning smallpox and vaccination are also conducted.

The Program headquarters is located at NCDC in Atlanta; the West African Regional Office is located in Lagos, Nigeria; technical advisors are assigned in: Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Dahomey, Gabon, Ghana, Guinea, Ivory Coast, Liberia, Mali, Niger (Niamey, Zinder), Nigeria (Lagos, Kaduna, Jos, Kano, Sokoto, Maiduguri, Ibadan, and Benin City), Senegal, Sierra Leone, Togo, and Upper Volta.

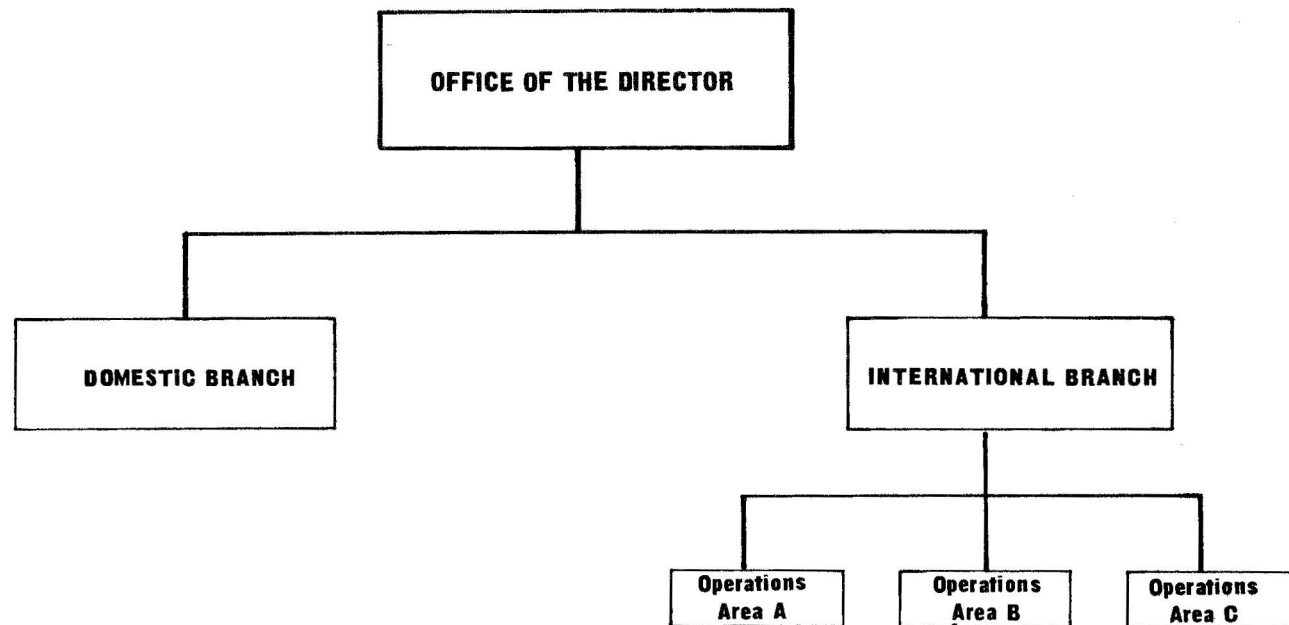
In the West African Program, Medical Officers serve as Medical Epidemiologists advising host country health officials on all phases of the eradication campaign, including specifically the development of surveillance and epidemiological resources. Non-medical "Operations Officers" advise host country health officials in day-to-day operational aspects, e.g. supply, logistics, field operations, team training, etc.

Headquarters posts are generally staffed by professional personnel promoted from field assignments and by epidemiologists of the Epidemic Intelligence Service (Epidemiology Program, NCDC, Dr. Alexander D. Langmuir, Director).

The laboratory needs of the program are served by the Vesicular Disease Virus Laboratory which, while administratively a part of the Laboratory Division, NCDC, is funded in large part by SEP.

# INTERNATIONAL BRANCH

The major activity of the International Branch is direction of the West and Central African Regional Smallpox Eradication and Measles Control Program. In addition, SEP maintains an emergency epidemic reserve of jet injection smallpox vaccine which is dispensed to control epidemics of smallpox occurring anywhere in the world except in the West African area. Both the West African Program and the epidemic reserve are financed in the main by funds from the U.S. Agency for International Development. One physician and one statistician from SEP Headquarters are currently detailed to the World Health Organization and the Pan American Health Organization, respectively.

In late 1966, a coordinated regional program to eradicate smallpox and control measles in five years began in West and Central Africa. The establishment of this program marked several historic precedents: it was the first coordinated attempt by several nations to eliminate smallpox from a large geographically contiguous region; it was the largest regional disease eradication program ever undertaken by the U.S. Agency for International Development and its predecessors; it was the first regional program of any kind to involve all of the independent nations of West and Central Africa; and it was the first international disease eradication program for which NCDC assumed directional responsibility. Its very existence, and its early successes, provided impetus to the World Health Organization to establish and appropriately fund a ten-year global assault on the disease. To rid the area from Mauritania to the Congo River of smallpox by 1972, individual countries with U.S. assistance initiated campaigns employing rapid jet injection techniques with the objective of vaccinating the entire population. Children under five have also been simultaneously vaccinated against measles which occurs with extreme severity in Africa. By late 1968, mass vaccination campaigns had reduced the reservoir of susceptible individuals to an all-time low. Intensified disease surveillance and epidemiologically directed "fire-fighting" are expected to eliminate the disease by the end of 1969.

Both Francophone (French-speaking) and anglophone (English-speaking) countries are participating, and reflect major ecologic, sociologic, historic, and epidemiological differences from the coastal rain forest to the Sahara desert. Both physicians and non-medical health workers are assigned in Africa. A tour of duty with the SEP in Africa lasts for a minimum of two years, of which at least 18 months is on-site in Africa. In most countries, assignments are located in the capital of the respective country while in Nigeria, assignments are also made to the capitals of the larger states. Personnel are presently assigned to Cameroon, Central African Republic, Chad, Dahomey, Gabon, Ghana, Guinea, Liberia, Mali, Niger, Nigeria, Senegal, Sierra Leone, Togo, and Upper Volta. The program maintains a Regional Office in Lagos, Nigeria, with responsibilities for coordinating inter-country transfers of material and personnel, for providing "trouble-shooting" administrative support to the individual country programs, and for conducting independent assessments of national eradication activities.

In January 1968, the Surgeon General of the United States Public Health Service visited several countries participating in the program. In Mampong Akwapim, Ghana, he and representatives of the WHO, OCCGE, OCEAC, and delegations from individual countries, celebrated the 25 millionth smallpox vaccination administered since initiation of the field activities in 1966.

# DOMESTIC BRANCH

The Domestic Branch coordinates efforts to keep the United States smallpox-free, one of its principal activities being the investigation of cases of suspected smallpox. Patients are seen and evaluated clinically and epidemiologically, and appropriate lab specimens are submitted to the Viral Exanthems Laboratory. Continuous surveillance is maintained on endemic and epidemic foci of smallpox throughout the world.

Since smallpox vaccination has been one of the cornerstones of the U.S. policy, the Domestic Branch has been involved in continuous studies of the safety and efficacy of smallpox vaccination and the duration of immunity produced by it. Basic information on primary and revaccination has been provided by studies in Tonga of jet injector vaccination and decay rates of antibodies. Several studies have been undertaken to document the toll of complications of vaccination, including an intensive analysis of importation epidemics of smallpox in Western Europe.

With the information gathered from these studies, the Domestic Branch has moved to reevaluate the relative importance of routine vaccination, surveillance, and outbreak control in keeping the U.S. free of smallpox.

The Domestic Branch maintains an ongoing literature review of smallpox and vaccinia.

# TRAINING ACTIVITIES

The SEP conducts two training sessions annually. The first is the annual Smallpox Eradication/Measles Control Orientation and Training Course conducted in Atlanta; the other is the annual in-service training and planning session (familarly known as the "Regional Meeting") which is held somewhere in Africa.

The Smallpox Eradication/Measles Control Orientation and Training Course is a formal course in the basic science and methods of disease control as applied specifically to smallpox and measles. It is open to host country counterparts and WHO personnel as well as U.S. advisors bound for Africa.
