

## Viewing the Smallpox Eradication Programme Archives with Internet Explorer

In recent versions of Internet Explorer, Microsoft has instituted several different settings to protect you from harmful websites. Any of these could be stopping you from viewing the site.

First, you may receive a message in a yellow box at the bottom of your screen. This asks if you want to view active content. Click "Yes".

This will allow you to view the site for that session, but the message will reappear each time you visit the site. To fix it permanently, locate the "Tools" tab and open its menu. There should be an item that says "ActiveX filtering". If it has a check next to it, click it so the check disappears.

Alternatively, you may get a message about incompatibility or inability to open the PDF files. Locate the "Tools" tab and open its menu. There should be an item that says "Compatibility View Settings". Click to open it. Type "zeropox.info" in the small box at the top, then click "Add". "Zeropox.info" should appear in the larger box, and you can close the Compatibility View Setting.

Hopefully, one of these should fix the problem. However, I use Mozilla Firefox, so Internet Explorer may introduce changes that I'm not aware of. Please let me know if you continue to have problems and I will research the solution through my contacts.
